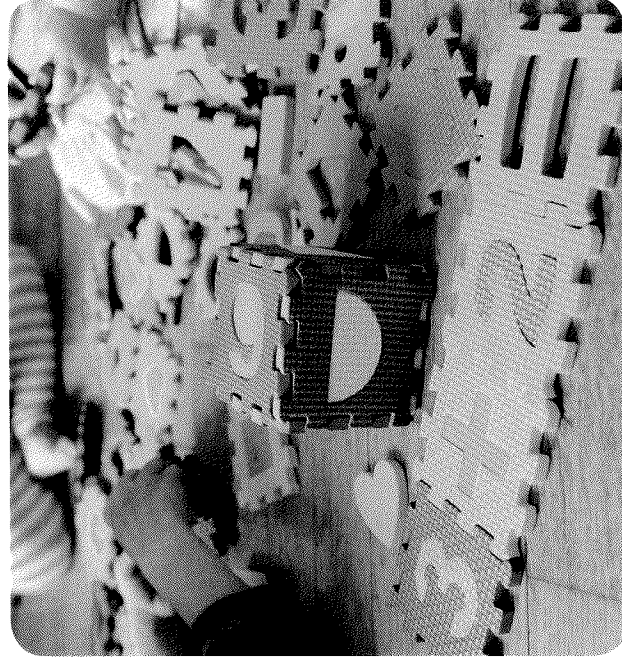

# Age-Specific Programs

## Infant

- Individualized programming based on open communication
- Daily written report
- Teachers specialize in infant care
- Our activities and equipment support physical, cognitive and social-emotional development



## Toddler

- Your child will be invited to participate in group activities that promote development across all domains
- Self-help skills and social skills are learned through daily routines
- Daily written report (upon parent request)

## Preschool

- Child-initiated activities guide intellectual, physical and social development
- Reading, writing and language development will be introduced through large and small group activities
- Children will master self-help skills and learn to resolve conflict through communication

## Four- and Five-Year-Old Program

- Through active learning, your child will become independent, responsible and confident
- Literacy, math and science skills are developed through individual and group activities using developmentally appropriate techniques
- Children will be encouraged to be active participants, taking part in decision making, activity planning and classroom maintenance
